Grantmaking and Impact Investing need to work together.

The Covid-19 pandemic, once again, has shown that LGBTQIA* communities in the Global South and Global East are among the most impacted and vulnerable in crises like this. Rapid climate change, political instrumentation and a bleak economic outlook further exacerbate the situation.

In order to build back stronger and better, we are convinced that philanthropic and investment efforts need to collaborate across both practices. Different forms of capital, from grants and investments over to blended solutions, are needed. We have termed this approach *holistic impact*. It has led us to ask ourselves some tough questions around our own funding strategy.

LGBTQIA* communities are already displaying tremendous resilience. However, as human rights and humanitarian aid funders as well as impact investors, we need to prioritise the communities' efforts to become even more autonomous for the longer term.



Our journey towards achieving holistic impact across grantmaking and impact investing continues. Our two pilot projects in <u>South Africa</u> and <u>Mexico</u> are two examples of how we are working at this intersection.
